German WorldTour riders at the start of the Deutschland Tour

Bad Soden – August 3, 2018. The new Deutschland Tour is a "must" for many German pro cyclists. With 15 German WorldTour riders on the preliminary start list, it is clear that the majority of the German elite has decided to take on the four-day stage race, which runs August 23-26 from Koblenz to Stuttgart.

The German contingent will be led by German national champion Pascal Ackermann, who has already ridden the entire course of the Deutschland Tour. Living up to the race's motto of "Deutschland.Deine Tour." his Bora-hansgrohe team will ride their homeland race with five German riders. Team Sunweb is also coming with a strong line-up, and will look to sprinter Max Walscheid. Team Katusha-Alpecin, with top sprinter Marcel Kittel, plans a team for every race scenario. There is still a large question mark as to the participation of Tony Martin, due to the injury he suffered in the Tour de France.

The fans of the Deutschland Tour can look forward to Maximilian Schachmann (Quick-Step Floors) and Nico Denz (AG2R La Mondiale) – two riders who put in an impressive first half of the season. The 24-year-old Schachmann was the best German in the Ardennes Classics and made his name not just amongst cycling fans with a stage win at the Giro d'Italia. Denz, the same age, showed with his stage second place at the Giro that he too would feel well on the challenging terrain of the Deutschland Tour.

André Greipel (Lotto Soudal) and Christian Knees (Team Sky) are two veterans who already have experience with the Deutschland Tour. For Greipel, it could be a jubilee, as he sprinted to stage win 10 years ago in the last running of the race.

Comments of the German WorldTour riders on the Deutschland Tour

Pascal Ackermann (Bora-hansgrohe): "A few days ago I rode all the stages and noted that the German Champion's jersey goes well with the Deutschland Tour. That is a really great stage race, a very interesting Classics tour. The profile is similar to my training area at home, complete with vineyards. Every day there could be a sprint or late attacks could be successful – I can do both and my form is good. That will be a really exciting race to watch, either live or on television."

André Greipel (Lotto Soudal): "After a ten-year break the Deutschland Tour is finally back. I remember the old race well and that is why I look forward to the new one. In Bonn, only 30 minutes away from my home, there is a sprint chance for me directly on the first day. That is practically a home advantage for me, which I can take advantage of. But no matter how it turns out, the main thing is that the fans come out to experience some great sport with us.

Christian Knees (Team Sky): "It is very good for me that Bonn plays such a big role in the new Deutschland Tour. My whole family can come there directly on their bikes. Maximilian Schachmann (Quick-Step Floors): "When I saw the profile of the Deutschland Tour, I thought: Perfect!
