



3,000 cyclists expected in Stuttgart and the Stuttgart region

**Germany's most important cycling race starts in four weeks. On 24 August, the Deutschland Tour will kick off with a prologue in Weimar. On five race days, the professionals will cover more than 700 kilometres to Stuttgart. On the final day, 3,000 amateur cyclists are also expected there for the Jedermann Tour.**

28 August is a fixed date in the calendar for enthusiastic road cyclists. At 9:15 a.m., the Jedermann Tour will start at the Schlossplatz in Stuttgart - the traditional prelude to the final day of the Deutschland Tour. Before the world's best professionals come to the state capital, the streets belong to the amateur athletes.

The participants who have registered for the shorter "Weinbergrunde" will start first in the centre of Stuttgart. The 57 kilometres with a not too difficult profile are perfect for beginners. 20 minutes later, the more ambitious cyclists will set off on the longer tour "Durch die Region Stuttgart". They can expect double the challenge: 116 kilometres and 1,050 metres of altitude.

Those who have not yet booked their starting place can do so quickly at [jedermann.deutschland-tour.com](http://jedermann.deutschland-tour.com). Participation is possible for as little as 90 euros - including a free jersey! For the Jedermann Tour, both routes are completely closed to car traffic, plus there is a well-filled starter's bag as well as catering and equipment service during the race.

#### **Free track test to get you in the mood for the Jedermann Tour**

To get in the mood for the race, training plans, maps and GPS data are already available for every participant. Those who want to have a dress rehearsal can test the routes of the Jedermann Tour for free on 14 August.

The route test is an offer organized by the Office for Sport and Exercise of the City of Stuttgart as part of the "Stuttgart bewegt sich" campaign. Accompanied by Nadine Berneis, former Miss Germany from Stuttgart, and multiple Tour de France participant Johannes Fröhlinger, cyclists will explore the two laps of the Jedermann Tour during a relaxed Sunday ride.
