



Classification Jerseys of the Lidl Deutschland Tour 2025

The Lidl Deutschland Tour 2025 will once again bring top international cycling teams to Germany. From August 20 to 24, they will battle over 741 kilometers from Essen to Magdeburg, competing not only for the overall victory and exciting stage wins but also for prestigious special jerseys.

Sustainable jerseys by Santini

Official outfitter Santini Cycling Wear has designed four sleek, minimalist jerseys for the 2025 Tour. Beyond their modern, aerodynamic fit, these jerseys stand out for their eco-friendly production, crafted from fibers made from recycled PET plastics and discarded yarns.

Blue jersey for the overall leader

The overall race leader will once again wear the striking blue jersey with yellow accents. In 2024, Team Lidl-Trek dominated the event, winning every stage and the overall classification. This year, the team returns to Germany aiming to defend both their title and jersey.

Green jersey for the points leader

To unseat Jonathan Milan (Lidl-Trek) as points leader this year, riders have multiple chances on every stage: two intermediate sprints and the stage finish all offer valuable points toward the Green Jersey. As with major tours like the Tour de France and Vuelta a España, Škoda proudly presents the Green Jersey at the Lidl Deutschland Tour.

Polka dot jersey for the best climber

Last year, Jørgen Nordhagen (Visma | Lease a Bike) claimed the King of the Mountains jersey after taking the lead on stage three. In 2025, riders will face ten mountain classifications across all stages leading up to the finale. The black jersey adorned with colorful dots in the Lidl Deutschland Tour's signature colors stands out clearly in the peloton.

White jersey for the best young rider

For the first time, the special classification for the best young rider will be presented by the Hamburg-based company LichtBlick, underlining their commitment to sustainable talent development. The White Jersey symbolizes the future of cycling and is fiercely contested among emerging talents. On his way to becoming the new German champion, Georg Zimmermann (Intermarché – Wanty) has already worn the coveted White Jersey twice, marking key milestones on his rise through the sport.
